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

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Chapter 1 — General Information

1-1 Introduction

This manual provides maintenance instructions for Anritsu Spectrum Master Models MS2722C, MS2723C, MS2724C, MS2725C and MS2726C. It provides a list of recommended test equipment, performance verification procedures, parts replacement procedures, replaceable parts list and test records.

Familiarity with the basic operation of the front panel keys is assumed (for example, how to change measurement mode, how to preset the instrument, or the meaning of "submenu key"). Before making any measurement, ensure that all equipment has warmed up for at least 30 minutes.

 - Replaceable parts list (Table 1-4)
- Performance verification procedures:

 - Copy the blank test records from Appendix A and use them to record measured values. These test records form a record of the performance of your instrument. Anritsu recommends that you make a copy of the blank test records to document the measurements each time a Performance Verification is performed. Continuing to document this process each time it is performed provides a detailed history of instrument performance, which can allow you to observe trends.

Caution Before making any measurement, verify that all equipment has warmed up for at least 30 minutes.

Chapter 2 — Spectrum Analyzer Verification

2-1 Frequency Accuracy Verification

Procedure

1. Connect the 10 MHz Reference source to the Anritsu MG3692X or MG3695C Synthesized Signal Source.

Note Do not connect the external 10 MHz Reference to the Spectrum Master.

- 2. Turn on the 10 MHz Reference Standard and the Anritsu MG3692X or MG3695C Synthesized Signal Source.
- 3. Set the MG3692X or MG3695C output to 1 GHz CW, with an RF Output Level of -30 dBm.
- 4. Connect the output of the source to the RF Input of the Spectrum Master.
- 5. Turn on the Spectrum Master.
- **6.** Press the **Shift** key and then the **Mode** (9) key. Rotate the knob to highlight **Spectrum Analyzer** and then press the **Enter** key to switch to Spectrum Analyzer mode.
- 7. Press the **Shift** key, the **Preset** (1) key, and then the Preset submenu key to reset the instrument to the default starting conditions. Press the **Shift** key, the **Sweep** (3) key, **Sweep Mode** submenu key and then the **Performance** submenu key.
- 8. Press the Amplitude main menu key and then press the Reference Level submenu key.
- 9. Use the keypad to enter -10 and select the dBm submenu key.
- 10. Press the Span main menu key, use the keypad to enter 10, and select the kHz submenu key.
- 11. Press the **BW** main menu key and select the **RBW** submenu key.
- 12. Use the keypad to enter 100 and select the Hz submenu key.
- 13. Press the VBW submenu key, use the keypad to enter 30 and then select the Hz submenu key.
- 14. Press the Freq main menu key and select the Center Freq submenu key.
- 15. Use the keypad to enter 1 and select the GHz submenu key.

- 7. Press the **Shift** key, the **Preset** (1) key, and then the **Preset** submenu key to reset to the default starting conditions. Press the **Shift** key, the **Sweep** (3) key, press the **Sweep** Mode submenu key and then the **Performance** submenu key.
- 8. Press the Amplitude main menu key, then press the Reference Level submenu key.
- 9. Use the keypad to enter 5 and select the dBm submenu key.
- 10. Press the Atten LvI submenu key, use the keypad to enter 15 and press the dB submenu key.
- 11. Press the **Freq** main menu key and select the **Center Freq** submenu key.
- 12. Use the keypad to enter 1.0 and press the GHz submenu key.
- 13. Press the Span main menu key, use the keypad to enter 110, and select the kHz submenu key.
- 14. Press the **BW** main menu key and select the **RBW** submenu key.
- 15. Use the keypad to enter 1 and select the kHz submenu key.
- 16. Press the VBW submenu key and use the keypad to enter 3, then select the Hz submenu key.
- 17. Press the Shift key and then press the Trace (5) key, then select the Trace A Operations submenu key.
- 18. Press the # of Averages submenu key, use the keypad to enter 3, then press the **Enter** key.




Figure 2-1. Resolution Bandwidth Accuracy Test Setup

Component Characterization




Figure 2-5. 2400 MHz TOI Verification Characterization, Component Characterization Setup

- 2. Set the MG3692x Synthesized Signal Generator to 2399.951 MHz CW, and set the Agilent 8648D Signal Generator to 2400.051 MHz.
- **3.** Set the Agilent 8648D Signal Generator RF to OFF ("RF OFF" appears on the right side of the display).
- 4. On the ML2438A power meter, zero the sensor and set the calibration factor to 2.4 GHz.
- **5.** Connect the power sensor to the splitter output and adjust the power of the MG3692x so that -20 dBm appears at the splitter output (approximately +16 dBm).
- 6. Turn Off the RF of the MG3692x Synthesized Signal Generator.
- 7. On the Agilent 8648D Signal Generator, turn the RF On, and adjust the RF amplitude so that -20 dBm appears at the splitter output (approximately +16 dBm).
- 8. Set the MS272xC to Spectrum Analyzer mode and then Preset the instrument. Press the **Shift** key, the **Sweep** (3) key, **Sweep Mode** submenu key and then the **Performance** submenu key.
- 9. Set the MS272xC as follows:

- 13. Press the Shift key and then the Trace (5) key. Press Trace A Operations, and set # of Averages to 2.
- 14. After two sweeps have occurred (Trace Count 2/2 appears on the left of the display), turn on a marker, and press Peak Search. Record the amplitude of the signal at 2400.151 MHz in Table A-63, "Spectrum Analyzer Third Order Intercept" on page A-34.
- **15.** Change the Center Frequency of the MS272xC to **2399.851** MHz. Record the amplitude of this signal in Table A-63.
- 16. Determine which signal is larger (the 2399.851 MHz signal or the 2400.151 MHz signal). Use the larger value for max in the following formula to calculate the TOI for 2400 MHz (refer to the example calculation below the formula):

TOI = -20 + [(-20 - max) / 2] dBm

Example: Assume max = -90 dBm

Then: TOI = -20 + [(-20 - (-90))/2] = +15 dBm

17. Record the calculated 2400 MHz TOI measurement in Table A-63.




Figure 2-6. 2400 MHz TOI Verification, Test Setup

3-2 Option 31, GPS Frequency Accuracy Verification




Figure 3-1. Frequency Accuracy Verification by Synthesized Signal Generator

Setup Procedure

1. Connect the GPS antenna to the GPS Antenna connector on the MS272xC.

If no fixed GPS antenna is available, the Anritsu 2000-1528-R GPS antenna can be used for this
 test. Ensure that the Anritsu 2000-1528-R GPS antenna is in a direct line of sight relationship to the satellites or that the antenna is placed outside with no obstructions.

- 2. Press the Shift key and then the System (8) key.
- 3. Press the GPS submenu key, then press the GPS On/Off submenu key to turn the GPS On.
- **4.** When the GPS fix is acquired, the GPS indicator at the top of the LCD display turns green. The latitude and the longitude are displayed next to the GPS indicator.
- **5.** After about three minutes, the Reference Source indicator in the lower left corner of the LCD display will change to *GPS High Accy*.
- **6.** If the GPS fix is acquired using the Anritsu 2000-1528-R GPS antenna outside, then bringing the instrument inside will cause a loss of satellite tracking. A red cross will appear on the green GPS indicator, and the Reference Source indicator will change to *Int Hi Accy*.

Note The following test can be used to verify frequency accuracy to either specification.

Test Procedure

1. Connect the external 10 MHz Reference to the Anritsu MG3692x Synthesized Signal Generator.

Note Do not connect the external 10 MHz Reference to the MS272xC Spectrum Master.

- 2. Connect the output of the Synthesized Signal Generator to the Spectrum Analyzer RF In of the MS272xC, as shown in Figure 3-1.
- **3.** On the MS272xC, change the mode to Spectrum Analyzer and preset the instrument.
- 4. Set the MG3692x output to 7 GHz CW, with an RF output level of -30 dBm.
- 5. On the MS272xC, press the Amplitude main menu key, and set the Ref Lvl to -10 dBm.
- 6. Press the Freq main menu key and set the Center Freq to 7.0 GHz.
- 7. Press the Span main menu key and set the Span to 10 kHz.
- 8. Press the **BW** main menu key and set RBW to 100 Hz.
- $\boldsymbol{9.}$ Press the VBW submenu key and set VBW to $\boldsymbol{30}$ Hz.
- 10. Press the Marker main menu key, then press the Peak Search submenu key.
- 11. Note the Reference Source display and use the appropriate row to record the data in the following steps.
- 12. Record the marker frequency into the "Measured Value" column of Table A-64, "Option 31, GPS Receiver Frequency Accuracy" on page A-35.
- **13.** Subtract the marker value from 7 GHz, record the result into the Error column of Table A-64, and verify that it is within specification.
- 14. If the value of Reference Source indicates *GPS High Accuracy*, then remove the GPS antenna and wait until the Reference Source indicates *Int Hi Accy* and repeat steps 16 through 19 if necessary.

- **2.** Press the **On/Off** key to turn on the MS272xC.
- 3. Set the MT822xB to Spectrum Analyzer mode and preset the unit.
- 4. Press the Shift key, and then the System (3) key.
- 3.3 V Test
 - 5. Connect the 4290 Adapter to the GPS Antenna SMA connector.
 - 6. Connect the GPS Terminator to the 4290 Adapter.
 - 7. Ensure the 3.3V setting on the GPS Voltage submenu key is selected (underlined)
 - 8. Turn GPS On by toggling the GPS submenu key so that the On text is underlined.
 - **9.** Select the GPS Info submenu key. Record the GPS Antenna Current reading in the "Measured Current Value" column of Table 3-1, "Option 31, GPS Receiver Bias-Tee Verification" on page 3-4 and verify that it is within specification.

5V Test

- **10.** Press the **Escape** key to dismiss the GPS Info dialog box.
- 11. Press the GPS Voltage submenu key and select 5V.






Figure 3-3. CDMA Signal Analyzer, Test Setup




Figure 3-4. WCDMA/HSDPA Signal Analyzer, Characterization Setup

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


Figure 3-5. WCDMA/HSDPA Signal Analyzer, Test Setup for Spectrum Master








Figure 3-7. Fixed WiMAX Signal Analyzer, Test Setup




Figure 3-8. TDSCDMA Signal Analyzer Option Verification, Test Setup




Figure 3-9. EVDO Signal Analyzer, Test Setup








Figure 3-11. Mobile WiMAX Residual EVM Test Setup




Figure 3-12. LTE Signal Analyzer Option Verification

- 12. Adjust the MG3700A Level setting to approximately -33~dBm so that the power meter reads $-50.0~dBm \pm 0.5~dB.$

- 7. Set the MS272xC to LTE Signal Analyzer mode and Preset the unit.

- **23.** For units with option 543, press the **Setup** main menu key and set the BW to 20 MHz then repeat Step 5a through Step 22 using the E-TM_3-1_20M pattern for Step 5i.

Chapter 4 — Battery Information

4-1 General Information

The following information relates to the care and handling of the Anritsu 633-44 battery pack and Lithium-Ion batteries.

- The battery supplied with the Spectrum Master may need charging before use. Before using the Spectrum Master, the internal battery may be charged either in the unit using the AC-DC Adapter (40-168-R) or the 12-Volt DC adapter (806-62), or separately in the optional Dual Battery Charger (2000-1374).
- Use only Anritsu approved battery packs.
- Recharge the battery only in the Spectrum Master or in an Anritsu approved charger.
- When the Spectrum Master or the charger is not in use, disconnect it from the power source.
- Do not charge batteries for longer than 24 hours; overcharging may shorten battery life.
- If left unused a fully charged battery will discharge itself over time.
- Temperature extremes affect the ability of the battery to charge: allow the battery to cool down or warm up as necessary before use or charging.
- Discharge the battery from time to time to improve battery performance and battery life.
- The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will eventually wear out.
- The battery may need to be replaced when the operating time between charging becomes noticeably shorter than normal.
- Never use a damaged or worn out charger or battery.
- Storing the battery in extreme hot or cold places will reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery.
- Never short-circuit the battery terminals.
- Do not drop, mutilate or attempt to disassemble the battery.
- Do not dispose of batteries in a fire!
- Batteries must be recycled or disposed of properly. Do not place batteries in household garbage.
- Always use the battery for its intended purpose only.

4-2 Battery Pack Removal and Replacement

This section provides instructions for the removal and replacement of the Spectrum Master battery pack.

Note Many of the procedures in this section are generic, and apply to many similar instruments. Photos and illustrations used are representative and may show instruments other than the Spectrum Master.

1. Locate the battery access door illustrated in Figure 4-1.

2. With the Spectrum Master laying flat and face up on a stable surface, grab the battery access door notch and pull the battery door down towards the bottom of the instrument as shown in Figure 4-2.


Figure 4-4. Removing the Battery

5-2 Opening the Spectrum Master Case

This procedure provides instructions for opening the Spectrum Master case. With the case opened, the internal assemblies can be removed and replaced, as detailed in the following sections.

- 1. Remove the battery door and battery as shown in Section 4-2 "Battery Pack Removal and Replacement" on page 4-2.
- **2. Units with Option 31:** Carefully loosen and remove the lock nut and washer from the GPS SMA connector. Carefully push the SMA into the case (Figure 5-1).





3. Place the Spectrum Master face down on a stable work surface that will not scratch the display.

4. Use a Phillips screwdriver to remove the four screws securing the two halves of the Spectrum Master case together (Figure 5-2).




Location of the 4 screws to remove.

Figure 5-2. Remove the Four Screws


5. Carefully lift up on the side of the case shown and begin to separate the two halves.

CautionDo not force or pull the two halves of the case apart completely, there are delicate cables attached
between the two halves that must be disconnected first. Refer to Figure 5-3 and Figure 5-4.
Note the position and routing of the cables, they should be similarly routed when the unit is
reassembled.

6. Partially open the case and carefully disconnect the ribbon cable that connects the Spectrum Analyzer Assembly to the Main PCB Assembly. The cable is attached between the two sides of the Spectrum Master.




Disconnect to separate the two halves of the Spectrum Master




- 7. The Spectrum Master can now be fully opened and laid flat.
- 8. Carefully remove the 3 connectors at the bottom of the Main PCB Assembly. Note the cable routing in the cable retainer and the location where each cable is connected.
- **9.** The two halves of the instrument can now be safely separated (Figure 5-4). Refer to the following sections of this chapter to remove and replace specific components of the instrument.

5-3 Spectrum Analyzer Module Assembly Replacement

This procedure provides instructions for removing and replacing the Spectrum Analyzer PCB Assembly. The Spectrum Analyzer Module Assembly is located in the back half of the case and includes the Top Connector Panel.

- 1. Open the case as described in Section 5-2 "Opening the Spectrum Master Case".




Figure 5-5. Spectrum Analyzer PCB Assembly

- **2.** Use a Phillips screwdriver to remove the six screws securing the Spectrum Analyzer Module Assembly to the back half of the instrument case (Figure 5-5).
- 3. Carefully lift up and remove the Spectrum Analyzer PCB Assembly and attached Top Connector Panel.

5-4 Main PCB Assembly Replacement

This procedure provides instructions for replacing the Main PCB assembly. The Main PCB assembly is located in the front panel half of the instrument.

- 1. Open the case as described in Section 5-2 "Opening the Spectrum Master Case".
- 2. For Main PCB Assembly replacement of units with Option 31. Remove the two screws holding the GPS PCB to the Main PCB Assembly. Straighten the bend tab in the upper-left corner of the PCB and remove the GPS PCB board and cable from the Main PCB. Reattach the GPS PCB and reroute the cable on the replacement Main PCB Assembly.





Figure 5-6. Disconnect the Cable Connectors on the Main PCB Assembly

- 3. Disconnect the Fan connector on the Main PCB Assembly (Figure 5-6).
- 4. Disconnect the Encoder Knob connector on the Main PCB Assembly.
- 5. Disconnect the Battery connector on the Main PCB Assembly.
- 6. Disconnect the LCD connector on the Main PCB Assembly.

- 8. Pull the Main PCB assembly out of the Front Panel section.
- **9.** Remove the LCD Assembly and attached to the replacement Main PCD Assembly and described in "LCD Assembly Replacement " on page 5-8
- 10. Replacement is the reverse of removal.

Note During reassembly confirm that the socket connector on the Main PCB aligns with the connector pin on the Keypad PCB shown in Figure 5-11 on page 5-10.

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5-5 LCD Assembly Replacement

This procedure provides instructions for removing and replacing the Liquid Crystal Display (LCD) once the Main PCB assembly has been separated from the Spectrum Master.

- 1. Open the case as described in Section 5-2 "Opening the Spectrum Master Case".
- 2. Remove the Main PCB assembly from the front panel as described in Section 5-4 "Main PCB Assembly Replacement".
- **3.** Turn the Main PCB Assembly and disconnect the LCD backlight cable and if still attached, disconnect the LCD cable from the Main PCB.




Figure 5-8. Replacing the LCD

- 4. Remove the four screws securing the LCD Display to the Main PCB assembly (Figure 5-8).

- 5. Carefully remove the LCD.
- 6. Reverse the above steps to install the replacement LCD.

Note Pay attention to the routing of the LCD Backlight Cable. The cable must be positioned so it is not pinched when the assembly is reattached to the front panel.

5-6 Keypad Membrane and Main Keypad PCB Replacement

This procedure provides instructions for removing and replacing the keypad membrane and PCB.

Note The keypad PCB and membrane can be replaced without opening the Spectrum Master case.

- 1. Place the instrument face up on a protected work surface.
- 2. Carefully remove the rotary knob, nut and retaining waster.
- **3.** There are eight locking tabs holding the keypad bezel to the case (Figure 5-9). Using a small flat-blade screwdriver, carefully pry the front bezel locking tabs free of the main body of the case. This will expose the keypad membrane.




Figure 5-11. Keypad PCB

5. Disconnect the function key flexible switchpad from J2 of the keypad PCB by carefully lifting the locking tab on connector J2 to release the flexible switchpad (Figure 5-11).


- **6.** Remove the Main Keypad PCB, taking care not to damage the speaker wires. The Keyboard PCB is attached to the Main PCB Assembly with the socket connector shown in Figure 5-8 on page 5-8.
- 7. Reverse the above steps to install the replacement assembly, with the following cautions:
 - Carefully close the locking tab on connector J2 to secure the flexible switchpad connection. The tab should "snap" into position when fully closed.
 - Insert the membrane over the keypad PCB, and under the speaker. Take care to properly orient the membrane so that the rubber pins are aligned with the keypad switches on the PCB.
 - The speaker is held in place by four locating pins on the inside of the keypad bezel. Verify that the four locating pins are properly seated into the four corner holes of the speaker when reinstalling the bezel.
 - Verify that all locking tabs are fully seated into the main body of the case when reinstalling the bezel.


5-7 Function Key Membrane and Switchpad Replacement

This procedure provides instructions for replacing the function key membrane and switchpad.

Note The function key membrane and switchplate can be replaced without opening the Spectrum Master.

- **1.** Place the instrument face up on a protected work surface.
- 2. Remove the keypad bezel and membrane as described in Section 5-6 "Keypad Membrane and Main Keypad PCB Replacement".
- **3.** There are six locking tabs holding the function key bezel to the case. Using a small flat blade screwdriver, carefully pry the function key bezel locking tabs free of the main body of the case. This will expose the function key membrane.
- **4.** Remove the function key membrane by gently pulling the membrane up and away from the front panel (Figure 5-12).





5. Disconnect the function key flexible switchpad from J2 of the keypad PCB by carefully lifting the locking tab on connector J2 to release the flexible switchpad (Figure 5-12).

6. Reverse the above steps to install the replacement switchpad or membrane.

• Carefully close the locking tab on connector J2 to secure the flexible switchpad connection. The tab should "snap" into position when fully closed.

Chapter 6 — Troubleshooting

This chapter describes the primary troubleshooting operations that can be performed by all Anritsu Service Centers. Perform the troubleshooting suggestions in the order they are listed. Operators of the Spectrum Master MS272xC should refer to the User Guide for troubleshooting help.

Only qualified Anritsu personnel should replace internal assemblies. Major subassemblies shown in Table 1-4, "List of Replaceable Parts" on page 1-5 are typically the items that may be replaced. Because they are highly fragile, items that must be soldered may not be replaced without special training. Removal of RF shields from PC boards or adjustment of screws on or near the shields will detune sensitive RF circuits and will result in degraded instrument performance.

Turn-on Problems

Unit cannot boot-up, no activity occurs when the On/Off key is pressed:

- **1.** Battery may be fully discharged. Use an external charger (Anritsu part number 2000-1374) to charge a completely discharged battery.
- **2.** Battery may be the wrong type. Use only Anritsu approved battery packs. Some non-approved battery packs will fit into the MS272xC, but are electrically incompatible and will not charge correctly.
- 3. External power supply may have failed or be the wrong type. Replace the external power supply.
- 4. On/Off switch is damaged. Replace the keypad PCB or rubber keypad.
- 5. Main PCB has failed. Replace the Main PCB assembly.

Unit begins the boot process, but does not complete boot-up:

- 1. Using Master Software Tools, perform the Emergency Repair procedure, then update the system software (via the Tools menu).
- 2. Main PCB has failed. Replace the Main PCB assembly.

Unit makes normal boot-up sounds, but the display has a problem:

- 1. If the display is dim, check the brightness setting under the System Menu / System Options.
- 2. Replace the Backlight Driver PCB.
- 3. Replace the LCD assembly.
- 4. The Main PCB has failed. Replace the Main PCB assembly.

Boot-up Self Test fails:

1. Perform a Master Reset.

If the message relates to the RTC battery, replace the RTC battery on the Main PCB.

2. The Main PCB has failed. Replace the Main PCB assembly

Other Problems

Battery Pack Charging Problems: refer to Chapter 4, "Battery Information".

Lock Error messages:

- 1. This message normally appears for 2 to 3 seconds when an external 10 MHz Reference is applied.
- 2. Spectrum Analyzer PCB has failed. Replace the Spectrum Analyzer PCB assembly.

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Spectrum Analyzer Problems:

- 1. Inspect the Spectrum Analyzer RF In connector for damage.
- **2.** Refer to the User Guide.
- 3. Update system software using Master Software Tools (via Tools menu).
- 4. Spectrum Analyzer PCB has failed. Replace the Spectrum Analyzer PCB assembly.

Other Issues:

- **1.** Perform a Master Reset.
- **2.** Refer to the User Guide.
- 3. Update system software using Master Software Tools (via Tools menu).
- 4. Replace the Main Spectrum Analyzer PCB assembly.
